**RESOLUTION NO. 001

**A RESOLUTION IMPLEMENTING THE PRICE CEILING ON PORK MEAT PRODUCTS IN ORMOC CITY BEGINNING ON JANUARY 17, 2022 THEREBY DIRECTING CONCERNED TRADERS, WHOLESALERS, AND RETAILERS TO ADJUST THEIR PRICES ACCORDINGLY AS FOLLOWS:**

**WHEREAS**, last 16 to 19 December 2021, Typhoon Odette (International code name: Rai) caused widespread devastation and damage to houses, infrastructure, properties, and agriculture, and resulted in the disruption of critical lifelines of Filipinos in areas affected by the said typhoon;

**WHEREAS**, the office of the President released proclamation no. 1267, Declaring a State of Calamity in Regions IV-B, VI, VII, VIII, X, and XIII. All departments and other concerned government agencies are hereby directed to implement and execute rescue, recovery, relief, and rehabilitation work in accordance with pertinent operational plans and directives. All departments and other concerned government agencies are also hereby directed to coordinate with, and provide or argument the basic services and facilities of, affected LGUs.

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) informs all consumers and retailers that based on Section 6 of R.A. No. 7581, as amended by RA 10623 otherwise known as the Price Act, prices of Basic Necessities in area proclaimed/declared a disaster area under state of calamity or under an emergency shall be automatically frozen at their prevailing prices or placed under automatic price control. Unless sooner lifted by the President of the Philippines, price control of basic necessities shall remain effective for the duration of the condition that brought it about, but not more than sixty (60) days.

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to said authorities, the LPPC of Ormoc City convened in a special meeting, dated January 11, 2022 for the purpose of responding to the call of the LGU to implement said price ceiling for selected pork products. The Council extensively discussed said matter together with several resource persons who are primary stakeholders on said date;





**WHEREAS**, pork products are considered basic necessities and among the common food readily available in the market. As such, it is included in the list of products that the LPCC regularly monitors to make sure that these products continue to be accessible at prices that are reasonable to the people especially the poor;

**WHEREAS**, in the recent turn of events, the people in Ormoc City clamors about the increasing and high prices of pork and chicken products. Inflation usually occurs when there is an increase in demand during holiday season. Apparently, in this time of health emergency, the prices skyrocketed which forced the government to act in response for the benefit and welfare of the general public;

**WHEREAS**, Section 2 of the Republic Act (RA) No. 7581 or the "Price Act", as amended by RA No. 1063, declares it a policy of the State to provide effective and sufficient protection to consumers against hoarding, profiteering and cartels with respect to the supply, distribution, marketing and pricing of goods during periods of calamity, emergency and widespread illegal price manipulation;

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Executive Order. No. 99, Series of 2020, approved by City Mayor Richard I. Gomez, in order to address exorbitant, excessive, and unreasonable increase of essential and prime commodities, the LPCC is vested with powers and functions necessary for the accomplishment of its goals and objectives. Among of its powers are the following, to wit:

1. Recommend to the National Price Coordinating Council or to the implementing agencies the suggested retail prices (SRP) and/or the price ceilings for certain basic necessities and/or prime commodities in their respective areas;
2. Recommend action steps to correct unwarranted price increases and supply shortages;
3. Activate coordination with appropriate government agencies in monitoring unwarranted price increases and hoarding of rice and other commodities.

**WHEREFORE**, on motion of Engr. Raoul Cam duly seconded by Mr. Abelardo Zacarias and Ms. Delia Vilbar, and without objection from the members, be it resolved to pass


